## GET TO KNOW THE EQUITY ARCATA BOARD!

The equity arcata Board held its inaugural meeting in October of 2023. The staff asked the Board members a few questions and some of their answers are featured here.

#### **SARAH KERR**

I have worked in community health care for over 20 years in a variety of roles and settings, currently as Vice President of Operations North for Open Door Community Health Centers. I'm also a founding board member of Humboldt Area Center for Harm Reduction and firmly believe that harm reduction has a vital role to play in many areas of social justice.

White supremacy culture creates and maintains inequities in the social, political, and economic status and outcomes of our society. As a white person, descended from colonizers and imperialists, I believe it is my responsibility to understand and dismantle these oppressive systems. I am motivated by a desire to improve the lived experience of everyone in our community – none of us are free until all of are free. I am eager to work towards these ends with equity arcata.





### **KAREN DIEMER**

Representing residents and visitors in our City has afforded me a lens into the barriers that exist that limit the choices available to many in our community.

My hope for equity arcata is two-fold. First, by supporting the work prioritized by our BIPOC community members we stay focused on eliminating those barriers most immediate in our local community. We know that by eliminating racially discriminatory barriers we improve access for everyone. And second, by being engaged in the work of creating a welcoming and equitable community we are more aware and have accountability to make change in our own organizations to end policies and practices and further inequities.

#### **ROSAMEL BENAVIDES-GARB**

I serve as the Associate Vice President for Diversity, Equity & Inclusion and Campus Diversity Officer for Cal Poly Humboldt.

Professionally, I have been motivated over decades of service to our university and community to model active leadership in all matters related to diversity, equity and inclusion, including direct support to equity arcata. Personally, I have a great sense of gratitude to the Humboldt community at large as my wife, Sarina and I have raised our three outstanding children, Benicio, Carmen, and Alejandro in this community.





#### **ROGER MACDONALD**

I am superintendent of the Northern Humboldt Union High School District and grateful for the opportunity to serve with equity arcata. We moved to my wife's hometown twelve years ago and our two children are products of Arcata schools; this community is very important to me.

Our community is much more strong and vibrant when all of us are seen and have the opportunity to live a rich and beautiful life. As I close in on thirty years in public education I have seen first hand how different a student can learn when they are celebrated for who they are and when they can see the contributions of their ancestry vauled and their culture honored.

# INTERNATIONAL LATINO FILM FESTIVAL

The International Latino Film Festival took place on the evenings of February 27th through the 29th at Mill Creek Cinema in McKinleyville. This fesitval is a partnership between Cal Poly Humboldt and the College of the Redwoods. The three films shown were *Nostalgia de la Luz* (2021), *El Abrazo de la Serpiente* (2015), and *A Million Miles Away* (2023). Each film was followed by a panel discussion and a Q&A with the audience.

Equity arcata sponsored and participated in the planning, assessment, and event support of the festival. This is the first time the film festival has been available fully in Spanish due to the work of the Cal Poly Humboldt Center for Interpretation and Translation.

One of our SAGE students, Kamar Little, is working on a mini documentary about the festival. Assessment for the event is being headed by equity arcata co-coordinator Lisa Bond-Maupin.

## **Safety Network**



On January 19, equity arcata met with Brenda Perez, members of Centro del Pueblo, Karen Diemer, Meredith Matthews, the Arcata Chief of Police and the Police Lieutenant to discuss a Safety Plan for the Sanctuary Gardens. In this meeting, attendees developed first steps to support and protect the Gardens as a sanctuary space and an integral part of the Arcata community.



One of these steps was the creation and installation of two new signs at Jardin Santuario. With art designed by a Centro del Pueblo member, these signs visibly reaffirm the City's support and protection of the space and invite assistance in the ongoing investigation of the hate crimes against the Garden and its community. On March 30, equity arcata joined Centro del Pueblo to celebrate unveiling the signs of solidarity.

### CAMPUS AND COMMUNITY DIALOGUE ON RACE



CDOR was held on October 23rd through October 27th, 2023. The theme was "(Re)Defining Difference, Honoring Collective Resistance." The keynote speaker was Dr. Tara Yosso who gave a talk titled "A Community Cultural Wealth Approach to Student Success: Reclaiming Our Past, Reimagining Our Future."

Other featured events included a film screening of "Many Moons" followed by a discussion with the director, Chisato Hughes, a talk from Dr. Verónica N. Vélez on "Building the Futures We Deserve: The Urgency of Intergenerational Movement-Building," and a presentation from Dr. James Binnall on "The Moral Character and Fitness Determination: Navigating the Process with a Criminal Conviction."
